

Social Security Benefits



Did the Social Security Administration (SSA) send you a notice that your benefits will be stopped, reduced, or that they paid you too much?

(benefit termination, reduction, or over-payment)

DO: File a Request for Reconsideration immediately.

DO: If you do these two things, SSA may keep paying your benefits while they consider your appeal:

- 1. State in your Request that you want benefits to continue during the reconsideration process.
- 2. SSA must receive it within 10 days from the date on the notice they sent you.



DO: Mail or fax the completed form to your local social security office. Keep copies!

- Find your local SSA office at https://secure.ssa.gov/ICON/main.jsp, in the phone directory under US Government Agencies, or call Social Security at 1-800-772-1213 (TTY 1-800-325-0778).
- The Grand Rapids SSA Office's fax number is 1-833-902-2660.
- If you fax your Request, keep your fax confirmation sheet as proof that you sent the Request, along with copies of the faxed documents.
- If you mail the Request, first make a photocopy and keep that for your records.



Don't *only* **call** the Social Security Administration or write them a letter. Instead use the Request for Reconsideration form. You can phone or send a letter as well if you like.



The final deadline for SSA to consider your Request for Reconsideration is 60 days after the notice date. In general, if SSA doesn't receive your appeal within 60 days from the date of the notice, they will not consider your appeal.*
