Credits can reduce the amount of tax you owe or increase your tax refund, and some credits may give you a refund even if you don't owe any tax.

- **The Interactive Tax Assistant (ITA)** helps you 1) decide whether you need to file, and 2) answer questions that come up a lot when filing: www.irs.gov/help/ita
- You can **file your taxes for free**, with help from tax-prep software, using **IRS Free File**: www.irs.gov/filing/free-file-do-your-federal-taxes-for-free
- **Free tax prep help.** Some taxpayers, especially 1) low- and moderate-income people, 2) those with disabilities, 3) those who have Limited English Proficiency, and 4) people 60 or older may **qualify for free tax prep help**: www.irs.gov/individuals/free-tax-return-preparation-for-qualifying-taxpayers
